

MINOR ACCOUNTS

The Credit Union provides a facility for children under the age of sixteen, known as minors. To open such an account an application form is completed by a parent or guardian (along with the minor if over seven years old). The parent or guardian must bring a long Birth Certificate and proof of parental ID and address (see adult account page 7).

Such accounts do not require payment of an entrance fee. They do, however, receive an annual dividend.



ADULT ACCOUNT

Membership of Beragh Credit Union is open to anyone who lives or works in the common bond area. To become a member, you must complete a membership application form in the office. Under law a new member must have proof of identify and address verification.

To establish identification (must include a photograph). **ONE** from the following list:

- Valid Driving Licence
- Valid Passport
- Electoral Identify Card
- Senior Citizen Smart Pass

For Address Verification (must be <u>dated within the last 3</u> <u>months</u>) **ONE** from the following list:

- Utility Bill
- Bank/ Building Society/ Credit Card Statement
- Official letter from a Government Body
- Doctor/ Dentist Letter

Note – an active account must have a minimum of $\mathfrak{L}5$ in shares.

DORMANT MEMBERS

If you are among the very few of our Credit Union members who have joined in the past but have not used your account in the last three years; your account can be reactivated by simply bringing in an up-to-date form of ID and proof of address and complete one transaction. This will enable you to avail of all the benefits of being part of a vibrant credit union. Please call into our office.



NOMINATION(S)

All members are encouraged to complete a Nomination of Beneficiary form. This allows a member to specify the person or persons to whom they wish their monies in the credit union to be transferred to in the event of their death. The maximum limit a beneficiary can receive under the credit union nomination is £20,000. The following points should be noted:

- 1. A nomination takes precedence over a will.
- 2. A nomination will be revoked if the member completes a subsequent valid 'Nomination of Beneficiary Form'.
- 3. A nomination will be revoked by the marriage of the member.
- 4. A nomination will be revoked by the death of the nominated beneficiary.

Where any of the above events (point 3 and 4) occur, and the nomination is revoked, members are encouraged to complete a new Nomination of Beneficiary form and submit it to the credit union.

Ownership

Beragh Credit Union is your credit union, owned by you the members, and decisions are made by

elected members who volunteer on the Board of Directors. As a non-profit organisation, any profit made is put back into improving the credit union and paying members in the form of dividends (interest on savings) and loan interest rebates.



Services

- Shares (Savings)
- A-Shares (savings that are not attached to a loan).



- Life Savings Protection Insurance (paid by Beragh Credit Union)
- Loans most of our loans are fully insured.
 Loan Protection Insurance is paid by Beragh
 Credit Union
- Death Benefit Insurance (paid by the member).

Savings (Shares)



One of the main aims of a credit union is to encourage members to develop the habit of regular savings.

In Beragh Credit Union the **present** maximum limit is £15,000 (Adult members) and £10,000 (Minor members).

Please note: When a member is granted a loan greater than the amount of savings at that time, those savings become pledged and may not be withdrawn (without consent from the Board) until the loan is repaid / substantially reduced.

Loans

Members of the credit union who are of full age (18 years) may apply for a loan.



A loan application may be made at any time during the normal office hours or online if you register with



https://www.beraghcreditunion.co.uk/ (this will be viewed by staff on the next business

day).



The maximum loan available would be £15,000 above the member's share balance. Beragh Credit Union's Loan Policy automatically allows members to borrow up to the amount of their savings at any time.

The following are some of the factors considered when a member makes a loan application:

- A regular pattern of savings.
- The member's previous loan repayment record.
- The purpose of the loan.
- The member's ability to repay as agreed.
- Frequency of loan applications.



If a loan cannot be authorised by staff in the office, it is assessed by the Credit Committee who meet every Tuesday evening between 8 pm and 9 pm.



Every loan application receives careful consideration and most loans – over 95% - are approved.

Loan interest of 1% per month (12% per annum) is applicable, equating to 12.68%

APR (Annual Percentage Rate). However, when the average Loan Interest Rebate is applied this reduces to approximately 8.8%.

You can repay the loan earlier with no penalty.

Repayment Difficulties - Should difficulties arise, the member should contact the office immediately, to discuss a way forward.





Moneyback

Receive annual dividend based on shares/savings. Also if you have a loan, we will refund some of the interest charged on members'

loans (known as Interest Rebate.)



Protection

Your loans and savings are protected at no extra cost to the member, by the credit union (subject to terms & conditions).

Savings Protection Insurance

The credit union provides Life Savings Protection Insurance cover on the savings of eligible members, at NO extra cost to the member. The amount of insurance benefit



depends on the member's age and savings history with the credit union. The intention is to reward consistent and regular savers.

Loan Protection Insurance



The credit union also provides at no extra cost Loan Protection Insurance cover for eligible members. Declaration of Health form may be required before a loan can be insured and issued

Insurance cover provided to eligible members will clear any remaining loan balance in the event of the member's death OR in the scenario where a healthy / working member who has become critically ill <u>after</u> the loan was taken out (the latter is dependent on the insurers assessment outcomes).



Savings Security - Your money is 100% safe as all credit unions are regulated by the Financial Service Compensation Scheme.



Death Benefit Insurance (DBI)



In Beragh Credit Union members have access to Death Benefit Insurance of $\mathfrak{L}2,000$ which is paid towards funeral expenses. This insurance has an annual charge. It is the member's

responsibility to ensure that both the form is completed and there are sufficient funds in their account to cover this premium. Please discuss with staff if you are unsure. A member must have **opened their credit union account before the age of 70 years old to avail of this insurance.**

Access

You can access your account 24/7 online if you register with the credit union's website https://www.beraghcreditunion.co.uk/, to view your balances and request a share withdrawal (which will be done during the next business day). You can also apply for a loan online.

Pay by Standing Order

Arrange to pay by Standing Order from your bank to your Beragh Credit Union account, either as a means of adding to your savings or repay your loan. Please contact our office for necessary banking details. You can request a statement free of charge at any time.

One can look back with pride and pay well-deserved tributes to those who had the foresight and courage to found the Credit Union Movement. The advent of the credit union was one of the factors which helped to lift the pall of gloom from this land. Today, again, we live in an era of doom and gloom. The credit union can give people the hope they are searching for, because of its success story it is a shining example and encouragement to those currently suffering the indignity of unemployment or cost of living crisis.

Testimonials

Since this is a celebration of the 50th anniversary of Beragh Credit Union, we are delighted that a few of the founding members or their families, as well as past and present volunteers and staff, have forwarded a few words on our most cherished credit union.

Founding Member - Anne Gallagher

Beragh Credit Union began with the study group set up to investigate the founding of a credit union to serve the people of the Beragh community.

The Study Group met on Thursday nights in the kitchen of St. Mary's Hall. We agreed that we would keep "Credit Union Time", a phrase coined by Jack Woods. That meant that the meetings would actually start on time, an unusual thing for most local committee meetings held in 1973. We did succeed in that timekeeping! And we learned about commitment, a lesson that was essential in the running of a fully-fledged credit union by a team of workers.

We had a savings programme from the outset. At least 50 pence a week was saved by each member of the study group. A bank account was opened, and Paddy Bogan looked after the money, as our first Treasurer. Jack McCann chaired these meetings and Jack Woods took the minutes. Clouds of cigarette smoke continuously filled the air. We ate raspberry ruffles and finished the night with tea and biscuits (mostly plain biscuits).

The purpose was to study the Credit Union Rule Book provided by the Irish League of Credit Unions based in Dublin. It was all a bit strange to most of us.

It was hard work to become familiar with the wording, the meaning and the reality of the rules. There were some wild stabs at the meaning of a few of the more difficult ideas. Help was given by our neighbouring



credit unions of Termonmaguirc and Errigal Ciaran, who were already members of the League at the time. Peter Curran, Termonmaguirc CU, Michael McGarvey and Michael McCrory (R.I.P), Errigal Ciaran CU, and Pat Donnelly, Fintona CU were always welcome visitors at our study group meetings.

After months of work we were finally ready to hold our Organisational Meeting where we would become an officially recognised Credit Union and a member of the Irish League of Credit Unions.

The eight signatories of that meeting were: Jack McCann (R.I.P), Paddy Bogan (R.I.P), Frank Horisk, Seamus Rodgers, Mary Tierney (R.I.P), Jack Woods (RIP), Louis McNamee (R.I.P.) and Anne Gallagher. Other members of that original study group were: David Mullin (R.I.P), Pat McSorley, Francis Broderick, Mary Ellen Rodgers (R.I.P), Hugh Colton (R.I.P), Jim Donaghy (R.I.P), Patrick McAleer and Liam Magee (R.I.P).

Beragh Credit Union Limited was up and running.

As the wife of a deceased founder member of Beragh Credit Union, I have been asked to recall a few anecdotes and memories of family life back in the 1970/80's for their 50 years souvenir booklet.

Some people would say life was more leisurely and relaxed 50 years ago. I don't really think so, at

least not for the family of Paddy and Teresa Bogan of Roscavey, Beragh.

In 1974 we had two young children, Mary (3 years old) and Aine (1 year old). Their father was Principal of Roscavey Primary School and was also very much involved in both parish and community work.

In 1973 he joined the Beragh Credit Union Study Group and subsequently became a founder member and Treasurer of the Credit Union which opened in 1974. If my memory serves me well, in those days the credit union opened on Friday and Saturday evenings and often the Treasurer was on duty both nights. With Paddy's other commitments, sometimes, Sunday was the only free "family-day" in the week, even then I can recall having to take the phone "off the hook" during Sunday dinner.

In the days before mobile phones, I remember Paddy's good friend and colleague Joe McCarney (sadly now also deceased) ringing up asking to speak to Paddy. It was 'one of those days' and my reply was, "You'll be lucky Joe, sometimes I feel I might try using the telephone box at the end of the road on the off-chance I might get to speak to him." Joe thought this was hilarious. At the time I was not amused because Paddy was so busy, but hindsight is a wonderful thing.

Paddy's iPhone was a pocket diary and a gold-plated pen. He treasured that pen, which incidentally he received as a gift for community work, and for years our daughters teased him about his precious gold pen. Our daughter Mary is now the custodian of that famous pen.



Over the years the children from the local primary schools took part in various competitions and quizzes sponsored by Beragh Credit Union. Two of our daughters won prizes at these events.

In 1983 Aine won a 1000-piece jigsaw. Her reaction was "Oh! What a big jigsaw. Where can I build it?" In 1986 Fiona won a TV. Her reaction was "Brilliant! Now I can watch TV in my room." But of course, she didn't! The TV was set up in the living room for all to watch.

Paddy passed away in September 2005 and we the family know he had many happy and worthwhile memories of achievements, friendships and social gatherings during his years in Beragh Credit Union. I think he would be happy and proud to know that our youngest daughter Roisin is now a member of the present Board of Directors.

Beragh Credit Union continues to grow from strength to strength with the last financial audit showing a 12% increase in loans to £1.86 million and a 4.8% increase in shares to £6.5 million.

My parents advised me from a very young age to join the credit union and it wasn't very long until I could see first hand the great support the credit union was to a lot of my friends as they took their first steps in life of needing a car, getting married, buying or building a house, planning a family holiday, getting children ready for school or college and at the latter part of life; funeral expenses. EARLY YEARS ~ The History Of Beragh C.U.

The first credit union in Ireland was opened in Donose, Co. Dublin in 1958. Two years later in 1960 Derry Credit Union Ltd opened in Northern Ireland. In 1974 Beragh Credit Union Ltd was established after a 2-year study group had been formed. The idea of a credit union in the area was first suggested by Jack McCann at a parish meeting in 1969 and on 3 Nov 1972 an initial meeting was held in St Mary's Hall, Beragh. Those present were Jack McCann, Pat McCartan, Pat Donnelly (Aughnagar), Frank Rodgers, Michael Ward, Barney Horisk and the convenors, Seamus Rodgers and Packie Kelly. After lengthy discussions it was decided to contact more people and carry out a study on the potential growth of a credit union in the locality.

Subsequently more local people were involved namely: Jack Woods, Paddy Bogan, Louis McNamee, Mary Tierney, Frank Horisk, Fr Kieran McOscar, Mary Rodgers, Anne Gallagher, Hugh Colton, Jim Mulholland, David Mullin, Francis Broderick, Mick Keenan and Pat McSorley. Others who gave valued assistance were Hugh Hackett, Hugh Ward, Frank Rodgers, Pat McAleer (Drumnakilly), Mickey McCabe, Neilly Hagan, Barney McCullagh, Pat McCartan, Mickey Kelly, Fr James Carroll and Liam Magee.

On 4 January 1973 a savings programme was started and speakers from neighbouring credit unions were invited to meetings. These included Peter Curran & Hugh Rafferty (Termonmaguirc), Brian Hamill and Mickey McCrory (Moyenir), John Anderson (Pomeroy), Pat Donnelly and Jim McGurn (Fintona) and Fr Paddy Gallagher (Dromore).

The Study Group continued to meet with a view to setting up a new credit union whilst adhering to the Standard Rule book.

On 19 April 1973 premises for savings were identified at John Donnelly's, Main Street, Sixmilecross and the following week at 43a Main Street, Beragh.

Many hours of hard work ensued, not without the usual teething problems, however, before being officially sponsored by Chapter 4 and formally recognised by the ILCU. By 30^{th} December 1973 Beragh Credit Union Study Group had, on the eve of affiliation, achieved the sum of £5,078.60. Now it has assets in excess of £7.9 million, Shares of £6.5 million, loans to members in excess of £1.86 million.


